<b>Audience</b>	Your speech showed you really knew the audience.	Your speech showed you knew the audience pretty well.	Your speech showed you didn't know much about the audience.	Your speech showed you didn't know the audience at all.
<b>Posture and Eye Contact</b>	You had great posture, and you made good eye contact.	Your posture was OK, and you made eye contact most of the time.	Your posture isn't very good. You need to make better eye contact.	You really need to improve your posture and make some eye contact.
<b>Word Choice</b>	You clearly made your points and didn't use filler words like "um" or "like."	You only used "um" and "like" a few times, and your speech was easy to understand. <b>Content</b>	Your speech was very worthwhile and had lots of excellent information.	Your speech had a lot of good information and seemed worthwhile.	You have some good information, but your speech would be better if you had more.	You don't have enough information to have a good speech.
<b>Use of Time</b>	Your speech was just the right length.	Your speech was a little long/ran a little short.	Your speech seemed to be too long/too short.	Your speech was very long/very short.
<b>Confidence</b>	You had a lot of confidence.	You seemed pretty confident.	You need to work on your confidence.	You didn't seem confident at all.
<b>Volume</b>	You could be heard by everyone in the room.	Most of us could hear you.	Only some of us could hear you.	Hardly any of us could hear you.
<b>Tempo</b>	You spoke at just the right speed – not too fast and not too slow.	Some portions of your speech went too fast/too slow.	A lot of your speech seemed to be too fast/seemed to drag.	You spoke much too fast/really need to pick up the pace.
