

Which Type of Speech Should I Write?

You've been given a broad topic for the Modern Woodmen of America School Speech Contest. There's a lot of information available on the subject, but your speech will only be a few minutes long. How do you know what to include and what to leave out? It helps to understand what choices are available to you.

Your speech will be one of three types:

- An **informational** speech: You give the audience *facts* about the subject.
- A **persuasive** speech: You *convince* your audience of something you believe.
- An entertaining speech: You share some thoughts with the audience in an *amusing* or interesting way.

Which type of speech is a good "fit" for you? Consider the following points:

- Do you ...
 - Enjoy research? Trivia games?
 - Keep up with current events? Think of yourself as curious?

If so, you may be interested in giving an informational speech.

- Do you ...
 - Like to voice your opinions?
 - Discuss issues with friends, trying to get them to see your side?

If so, you may enjoy writing and delivering a persuasive speech.

- Are you ...
 - Able to tell interesting stories easily?
- Considered to have a good sense of humor? If so, you might want to write an entertaining speech.

Understanding the goal of your speech helps you focus. Think before writing: *What do I want to accomplish through my speech?* Do I want to ...

- *Inspire* the audience?
- Honor someone or something?
- Ask the audience to do something about an issue?
- *Explain* something?
- Remember something or someone?
- Express *thanks* for someone or something?
- Support an issue?
- Offer a criticism?
